## Kitchener-Waterloo Art Gallery Temporarily Closed as Transformative Lobby Renovation Begins

15 January 2019, Kitchener ON – The Kitchener-Waterloo Art Gallery will be closed to the general public from today through to Saturday 19 January as we embark on the first stages of a major lobby renovation that will transform the Gallery's primary entry and visitor experience.

From January through to April 2019, KWAG will undertake a substantial facility upgrade project that will take major strides towards achieving legal accessibility standards while going beyond compliance to create an inclusive and welcoming lobby space.

"At KWAG we believe in providing visitors with a welcoming and comfortable experience that connects the Gallery with the urban fabric of the city," says Shirley Madill, Executive Director. "The design of the new lobby embraces the visitor and ignites the imagination upon entry." Upon completion, visitors will be able to enjoy the following new features:

- Redesigned Visitor Services Centre aligned with the Community Access Space
- Interactive Education Hub with integrated technology designed to support handson learning and online exploration of the creative process
- A new central gathering area for visitors to relax and meet with friends
- Fully accessible gender-neutral washrooms
- Polished concrete flooring and raised ceiling height

Demolition of the lobby is presently underway with a projected completion date of late April 2019 in anticipation of the Opening Reception of *Expressions 44*, KWAG's annual and highly popular exhibition of student artwork from across Waterloo Region. Despite the inevitable disruptions that will accompany this renovation, the Gallery is committed to maintaining regular hours and programming over the coming three months; visitors are asked to regularly check our <u>website</u>, <u>KWAG Weekly e-newsletter</u> and social media during this time to receive notice of changes to hours and events.

The Kitchener-Waterloo Art Gallery is grateful for the support and oversight of the City of Kitchener in these improvements to our home in the Centre in the Square.
