*February Events at KWAG Explore Hospitality and Home*

**30 January 2018, Kitchener ON** – The Kitchener-Waterloo Art Gallery expands on its 2018 theme of hospitality with a free February Film Series and two Open Conversations that share culturally diverse experiences of finding and making a home in Canada.

**Open Conversations** features Kitchener-based spoken word artist and musician **Janice Jo Lee** as the host of two evenings that ask the question: What is a warm welcome? Through conversation with invited guests **Amy Smoke**, a Mohawk woman and advocate for Indigenous women and youth, and **Nada Humsi**, a Syrian-born theatre artist and Artistic Associate at MT Space, Lee will explore differing cultures of hospitality.

Thursday 1 March: Janice Jo Lee with Nada Humsi, 7-8 pm

Both events are pay-what-you-can, with proceeds going to the Food Bank of Waterloo Region.

Our **February Film Series** complements our current exhibitions with Canadian documentaries that reveal the struggle to establish and sustain a sense of home. From the challenges of immigration to vanishing ways of life in northern reserves and southern prairies alike, these four films offer uniquely personal perspectives on wider social change.
